#### what

following the ACT Affordable Housing threshold requirements, homes with Net Living Area (NLA) of 81 - 105 sq m will be subject to a threshold of \$341,000

### the proposal

looks at combining the area and cost thresholds of 2 households to allow the construction of a spacious home with adequate parking, private and functional outdoor space - all within a single dwelling. This enables a dwelling of up to 210 sq m with a threshold of \$682,000

## suitable for who?

- 2 young families
- a young family and grandparents
- friends looking to get established within the property market

## unique characteristics

the single dwelling contains both shared and private areas for the residents.

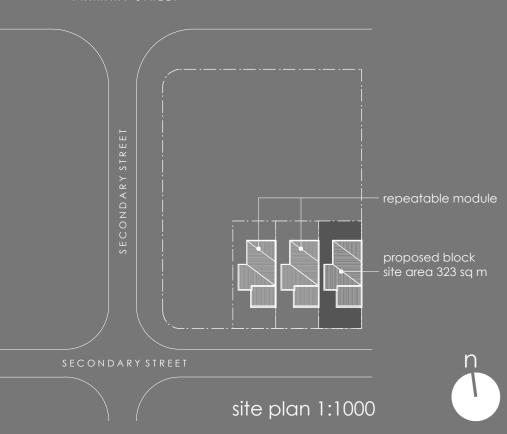
shared: secure parking, kitchen, laundry, living, dining, toilet and outdoor areas

bedrooms, bathrooms, living / family area

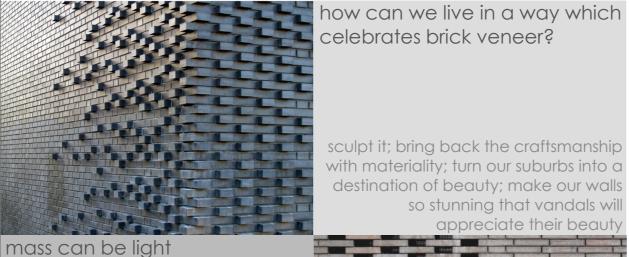

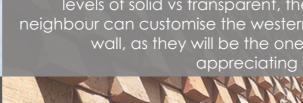
