Latest architectural trends on show

The latest trends in residential architecture and the stories behind the design of some of NSW's newest public and urban projects will be showcased at the Australian Institute of Architects this week.

On Friday 21 March and Saturday 22 March, many of the state's leading architects will present their entries to the juries of this year's NSW Architecture Awards at a free public event held at Tusculum (3 Manning Street) in Potts Point.

More than 190 projects will be presented by their respective architects over the two days as they vie for top honours in a range of categories, including Public Architecture, Urban Design, Commercial Architecture, Interior Architecture, Residential Architecture (Houses, Alterations and Additions, and Multiple Housing categories), and the COLORBOND® Award for Steel Architecture.

The juries for this year's awards are comprised of 16 respected and experienced architects and industry leaders from across the profession including previous NSW Architecture Award winners.

The Friday 21 March presentations will provide architecture students and professionals alike with the chance to gain an insight into the latest trends in public, urban, commercial and interior architecture as well as Multiple Housing design, with presentations from a number of architectural firms including but not limited to:
