



Kenneth Frank Woolley AM LFRAIA, 29 May 1933 – 25 November 2015

Woolley was awarded the highest architectural honour in Australia when he received the RAIA Gold Medal in 1993.

Kenneth Frank Charles Woolley AM, B.Arch. (Hons) LAIA, (born 29 May 1933 in Sydney) was an influential Australian architect. In a career spanning more than 50 years, he is best known for his contributions to project housing with Pettit and Sevitt, the Wilkinson Award winning Woolley House in Mosman, and his longstanding partnership with Sydney Ancher and Bryce Mortlock. He is regarded as being a prominent figure in the development of the Sydney School movement and Australian vernacular building.
